

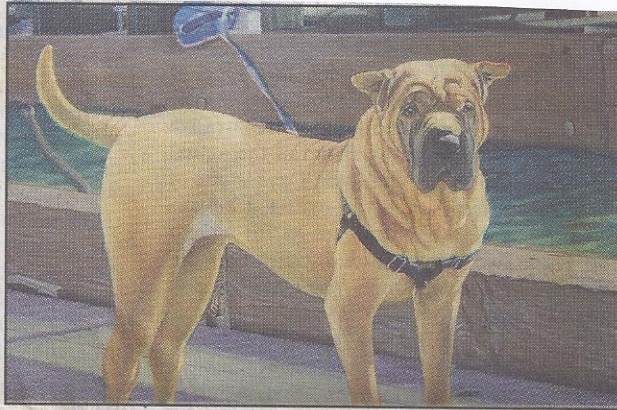
“Get Real” Exhibit Features Paintings by Leichter and Drawings by Slaton
